

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
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THE BASIC KNOT




Use for oblong or square scarves.

- **1.** Cross right over left, bring it under up and over the top.
- 2. Cross right over left.




- **3.** Bring right side around back of left side and through the loop created by doing so.
- 4. Pull tight and you have the Basic Knot.

HOW TO TURN YOUR SQUARE INTO AN OBLONG




- 1. Fold one corner in slightly past center.
- **2.** Fold opposite corner in on top of first fold.




- **3.** Fold each side in toward center once again.
- **4.** Fold in half you now have an oblong to work with.

DIAGONAL WRAP






1. Wrap square into a triangle by joining opposite corners.




2. Wrap across shoulders and tie with a Basic Knot (see page 4) or fasten with a brooch. Wear as pictured or with point in back and knot center front or vice versa.


SCARF COLLAR




1.



- 1. Fold your square scarf in half.
- **2.** Hold points A and B (keeping both layers of scarves together) and pull.



3. Place center at back of neck.



4. Bring ends around to front and tie in a basic knot (see page 4).

SIMPLE ASCOT



Fold an oblong scarf in half or, fold a square scarf into an oblong (see page 4).




1. Put center of scarf at back of neck, with ends even in front. Cross right over left; bring it under, up, and over the top.




2. Fan out. Wear tucked in or out.

FRONT LOOP


Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong - see page 4).




1. Place center at back of neck. Bring ends around to front. Cross right side over left. Bring up, under, and over the top.



2. Cross left over right. Bring left behind right. Bring left through the space between them. Pull tight form a loop at the front of the neck.




3. Pull ends around back and tie in knot. Tuck ends under.




4. Here is how it looks, a silken necklace.

SQUARE SCARF TWICE-AROUND ASCOT



1. Fold square scarf by joining opposite corners.



2. Put around neck with point of scarf in front. Cross ends behind neck and bring around front.



3. Tie basic knot (see page 4), or leave loose as pictured on right.




OBLONG SCARF TWICE-AROUND ASCOT



Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong - see page 4).



1. Place middle of scarf at front of neck, with ends over shoulders in back. Cross ends in back and bring to front.



2. Loop one end over the other and fluff out. Tuck ends in and wear like an ascot, or leave loose for a more casual look.

CHAIN 'NECKLACE'


Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong - see page 4).



- 1. Place center of scarf at back of neck.
- **2.** Cross right over left. Bring right behind left, up and over. Repeat



again (bring right up and behind scarf around neck) and again until only the end of the scarf remains.



- **3.** Repeat the same with the other side of the scarf until only the end of the scarf remains.
- **4.** Tie two ends together in a basic knot (see page 4). Tuck ends in.

DOUBLE TWIST


Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong - see page 4).



 Place center at back of neck. Bring ends around front. Cross right side over left.


3. Pull ends around back and tie in

basic knot (see page 4). Tuck under.




2. Cross left side over right.

4. Arrange twist at front of neck.




CRAVATE

Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong – see page 4).



1. Place scarf at back of neck with right side longer than left.



Place right over left and pull behind. Place right over left again and pull under and up through scarf around neck.




3. Put through second loop on front and pull tight.


If scarf is an extra long oblong, wrap twice around neck as shown in photo.



MUFFLER



 $\textbf{1. \& 2.} \ \text{Fold a square scarf in half and then in half again. (Or, start with an oblong.)}$



3. Place center at the back of neck and cross right over left.



4. Tuck inside lapels of coat, jacket, dress or blouse.

POOF


Start with an oblong (or turn your square into an oblong – see page 4).



1. Tie a loose knot at one end of scarf.



2. Place center of scarf at back of neck




 Pull end without the knot through the loop of the knot.
 Tighten knot by pulling end of scarf with knot. 'Poof' ends out.




HACKING KNOT






Fold an oblong scarf in half.
 Drape around neck from back to front




Pull two loose ends through loop formed by center fold.Pull ends until scarf is adjusted as desired.

THE TWISTER


Turn your square scarf into an oblong - see page 4 (or, start with an oblong.)




1. Fold in half. Grasp center of scarf with right hand and twist scarf until you have about 3" left at bottom untwisted.



2. Place around neck so that twisted part is in front.



3. Thread one of the ends into the loop. Tie a knot with both ends.




4. Arrange scarf so that twisting is even and knot is in back.

GYPSY




1. Fold your square scarf in half.
Place center over forehead while grasping each end.



2. Pull ends around to the center of back. Cross right over left, loop under and over to tie.




3. Cross left over right. Bring left side around back of right side and through the loop created by doing so.




4. Pull tight forming the Basic Knot (page 4) and arrange on head.

GLAMOUR WRAP




1. Fold square scarf into a triangle by joining opposite corners.






2. Place on head as shown, cross under chin.



3. Tie a double knot on the side or in back. Add sunglasses and look like a movie star!

SIMPLE HEADBAND


Start with an oblong or turn your square scarf into an oblong (page 4).




- **1.** Place center at the middle of head. Grasp ends.
- **2.** Pull around back and tie in Basic Knot (page 4).
- **3.** Arrange on head either with both ends down back, or with ends of scarf over shoulder.

TWISTED HEADBAND

Turn your square scarf into an oblong (page 4), or start with an oblong.



- **1.** Place center of scarf at back of neck.
- **2.** Grasping ends, pull forward to the top center of hairline.




3. Cross right over left, then left over right. Pull ends around back and knot.




PONYTAIL TIE


Start with an oblong or turn your square scarf into an oblong (page 4).



1. Brush hair into a ponytail and secure with an elastic. Place center of scarf on top middle part of ponytail if your scarf is long. If your scarf is short, place center of scarf on bottom middle part of ponytail.



2. Cross right over left. For short scarves, tie in Basic Knot (page 4).




3. For long scarves, bring ends up over top of ponytail, cross and loop back under and tie in Basic Knot (page 4).



SIMPLE BELT

Start with an oblong or turn your square into an oblong (page 4).



 Gather or pleat scarf and thread through belt loops.
 Tie ends in Basic Knot (page 4).
 Fluff ends out or tuck in.



CELL PHONE HOLDER

Start with an oblong or turn your square into an oblong (page 4).



1. Tie a knot in each end so that you have about 18" in center.



2. Pull ends to tighten knot.




Place center of scarf at center of waist, pull ends around back and tie in knot.








2. Open sides.



3. Put arms through the open sides.




4. A stylish jacket or overblouse.


BASIC BLOUSE



1. Fold square scarf in half as a triangle. Grasp each end at point of triangle and bring around back of neck.



2. Tie knot at back of neck. Grasp ends at bottom and bring around back.




3. Tie in knot. This looks terrific under a jacket or by itself.



BANDEAU

Start with an oblong or turn your square scarf into an oblong (page 4).



- 1. Grasp ends as shown.
- 2. Twist or tie a knot in the middle.
- **3.** Place over breasts, pull ends around to back.
- **4.** Knot in back. Tuck ends in or leave them loose.
